Key Issues Discussed:

- 1. The infrastructural developments which were conducted by Petrotrin during periods of higher oil prices.
- 2. The status of the South West Soldado Field Project including:
 - > Phase 1 of the project is only 65% completed after six years at a cost of \$1.2 Bn;
 - > The projected completion date is in 2019;
 - The costs involved in the project i.e. the initial estimated cost \$400M, the projected completion cost \$1.7 Bn and the costs incurred after initialization;
 - The contributing factors of the current timeframe of six years versus initial estimated time period of two years;
- 3. The reasons for the delay in the completion of the South-West Soldado Field Project are:
 - issues with the execution of contracts for the Temporary Facility; and
 - the non-completion of the pipeline network.
- 4. The reasons for the continuous termination of contracts for the South-West Soldado Field Project and the consequences or lack thereof for the persons in charge of awarding the contracts;
- 5. The status of the South-West Soldado Field Project in contributing to an increase in employment opportunities in Point Fortin;
- 6. The 2015 Audit Report of the South West Soldado Field Project and the reason for the ongoing legal process in addressing the findings of the report; and
- 7. The inadequate ability of Petrotrin's current management and operationalization structure to secure the future of the company.
